WATER POETRY — ACROSTIC

Definition: Acrostic (noun): A poem, word puzzle, or other composition in which certain letters in each line form a word or words.

Materials: Paper, pencil, art supplies (optional)

Directions: Write an acrostic poem about water.

This activity can be done as an entire class, in small groups, or individually.

1. Write the word "WATER" or a water-related word down the left side of your paper in a vertical direction. Use big, capital letters, one per line. Alternatively, you may use the template on the next page.

- 3. Use color and artwork to frame the poem.
