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#### 4.3 DESCRIPTION OF TEST MODES

The EUT has been tested under its typical operating condition.

The EUT configuration for testing is installed on RF field strength measurement to meet the Commissions requirement and operating in a manner which intends to maximize its emission characteristics in a continuous normal application.

The Transmitter was operated in the normal operating mode. The TX frequency was fixed which was for the purpose of the measurements.

Test of channel included the lowest and middle and highest frequency to perform the test, then record on this report.

Those data rates ( $\boxtimes$ 802.11b:1 Mbps; $\boxtimes$ 802.11g: 6 Mbps; $\boxtimes$ 802.11n(HT20): MCS0; $\subseteq$ 802.11n(HT40): MCS0) were used for all test.

Pre-defined engineering program for regulatory testing used to control the EUT for staying in continuous transmitting and receiving mode is programmed.


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#### 7 SETUP OF EQUIPMENT UNDER TEST

#### 7.1 RADIO FREQUENCY TEST SETUP 1

The WLAN component's antenna ports(s) of the EUT are connected to the measurement instrument per an appropriate attenuator. The EUT is controlled by PC/software to emit the specified signals for the purpose of measurements.



#### 7.2 RADIO FREQUENCY TEST SETUP 2

The test site semi-anechoic chamber has met the requirement of NSA tolerance 4 dB according to the standards: ANSI C63.10. The test distance is 3m.The setup is according to the requirements in Section 13.1.4.1 of ANSI C63.10-2013 and CAN/CSA-CEI/IEC CISPR 22.

#### Below 30MHz:

The EUT is placed on a turntable 0.8 meters above the ground in the chamber, 3 meter away from the antenna (loop antenna). The Antenna should be positioned with its plane vertical at the specified distance from the EUT androtated about its vertical axis formaximum response at each azimuth about the EUT. The center of the loopshall be 1 m above the ground. For certain applications, the loop antennaplane may also need to be positioned horizontally at the specified distance from the EUT.


#### 30MHz-1GHz:

The EUT is placed on a turntable 0.8 meters above the ground in the chamber, 3 meter away from the antenna. The maximal emission value is acquired by adjusting the antenna height, polarisation and turntable azimuth. Normally, the height range of antenna is 1 m to 4 m, the azimuth range of turntable is 0° to 360°, and the receive antenna has two polarizations Vertical (V) and Horizontal (H).

## Above 1GHz:

The EUT is placed on a turntable 1.5 meters above the ground in the chamber, 3 meter away from the antenna. The maximal emission value is acquired by adjusting the antenna height, polarisation and turntable azimuth. Normally, the height range of antenna is 1 m to 4 m, the azimuth range of turntable is 0° to 360°, and the receive antenna has two polarizations Vertical (V) and Horizontal (H).


## (a) Radiated Emission Test Set-Up, Frequency Below 30MHz




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## (b)Radiated Emission Test Set-Up, Frequency Below 1000MHz



## (c) Radiated Emission Test Set-Up, Frequency above 1000MHz




## 7.3 CONDUCTED EMISSION TEST SETUP

The mains cable of the EUT (maybe per AC/DC Adapter) must be connected to LISN. The LISN shall be placed 0.8 m from the boundary of EUT and bonded to a ground reference plane for LISN mounted on top of the ground reference plane. This distance is between the closest points of the LISN and the EUT. All other units of the EUT and associated equipment shall be at least 0.8m from the LISN. Ground connections, where required for safety purposes, shall be connected to the reference ground

point of the LISN and, where not otherwise provided or specified by the manufacturer, shall be of same length as the mains cable and run parallel to the mains connection at a separation distance of not more than 0.1 m.



The minimum -6 dB bandwidth shall be at least 500 kHz.

## 8.1.3 Test Configuration

Test according to clause 7.1 radio frequency test setup 1

## 8.1.4 Test Procedure

The EUT was operating in IEEE 802.11b/g/n mode and controlled its channel. Printed out the test result from the spectrum by hard copy function.

The RF output of EUT was connected to the spectrum analyzer by RF cable and attenuator. The path loss was compensated to the results for each measurement.

Set to the maximum power setting and enable the EUT transmit continuously

Set RBW = 100 kHz.

Set the video bandwidth (VBW) =300kHz.

Set Span=2 times OBW

Set Detector = Peak.

Set Trace mode = max hold.

Set Sweep = auto couple.

Allow the trace to stabilize.

Measure the maximum width of the emission that is constrained by the frequencies associated with the two outermost amplitude points (upper and lower frequencies) that are attenuated by 6 dB relative to the maximum level measured in the fundamental emission.

Measure and record the results in the test report.



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


DTS (6dB) Bandwidth 802.11b Channel 1: 2412MHz





DTS (6dB) Bandwidth 802.11b Channel 6: 2437MHz






DTS (6dB) Bandwidth 802.11b Channel 11: 2462MHz





DTS (6dB) Bandwidth 802.11g Channel 1: 2412MHz






Test Model DTS (6dB) Bandwidth 802.11g Channel 6: 2437MHz




DTS (6dB) Bandwidth

Channel 11: 2462MHz






DTS (6dB) Bandwidth 802.11n (HT20) Channel 1: 2412MHz





## 8.2 MAXIMUM CONDUCTED(AVERAGE) OUTPUT POWER

#### 8.2.1 Applicable Standard

According to FCC Part15.247 (b)(3) and KDB 558074 D01 15.247 Meas Guidance v05r02

#### 8.2.2 Conformance Limit

The maximum peak conducted output power of the intentional radiator for systems using digital modulation in the 2400 - 2483.5 MHz bands shall not exceed: 1 Watt (30dBm).

## 8.2.3 Test Configuration

Test according to clause 7.1 radio frequency test setup 1

#### 8.2.4 Test Procedure

- a) Set span to at least 1.5 times the OBW.
- b) Set RBW = 1-5% of the OBW, not to exceed 1 MHz.
- c) Set VBW  $\geq$  3 x RBW.
- d) Number of points in sweep  $\geq 2 \times \text{span} / \text{RBW}$ . (This gives bin-to-bin spacing  $\leq \text{RBW}/2$ , so that narrowband signals are not lost between frequency bins.)
- e) Sweep time = auto.
- f) Detector = RMS (i.e., power averaging), if available. Otherwise, use sample detector mode.
- g) If transmit duty cycle < 98 %, use a sweep trigger with the level set to enable triggering only on full power pulses. The transmitter shall operate at maximum power control level for the entire duration of every sweep. If the EUT transmits continuously (i.e., with no off intervals) or at duty cycle  $\geq$  98 %, and if each transmission is entirely at the maximum power control level, then the trigger shall be set to "free run".
- h) Trace average at least 100 traces in power averaging (i.e., RMS) mode.
- i) Compute power by integrating the spectrum across the OBW of the signal using the instrument's band power measurement function, with band limits set equal to the OBW band edges. If the instrument does not have a band power function, sum the spectrum levels (in power units) at intervals equal to the RBW extending across the entire OBW of the spectrum.




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

Channel 1: 2412MHz



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


802.11b Channel 1: 2412MHz


Channel 6: 2437MHz



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


# MAXIMUM CONDUCTED(AVERAGE) OUTPUT POWER 802.11b







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


# MAXIMUM CONDUCTED(AVERAGE) OUTPUT POWER 802.11n(HT20)


# MAXIMUM CONDUCTED(AVERAGE) OUTPUT POWER 802.11n(HT20)

This procedure shall be used if maximum peak conducted output power was used to demonstrate compliance

The transmitter output (antenna port) was connected to the spectrum analyzer

Set analyzer center frequency to DTS channel center frequency.

Set the span to 1.5 times the DTS bandwidth.

Set the RBW to: 3 kHz Set the VBW to:10 kHz. Set Detector = peak.

Set Sweep time = auto couple. Set Trace mode = max hold. Allow trace to fully stabilize.

Use the peak marker function to determine the maximum amplitude level within the RBW.

Note: If antenna Gain exceeds 6 dBi, then PSD Limit=8-(Gain- 6)



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


Power Spectral Density 802.11b Channel 1: 2412MHz


Power Spectral Density 802.11b Channel 6: 2437MHz



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


Power Spectral Density 802.11g Channel 1: 2412MHz



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


Power Spectral Density 802.11g Channel 6: 2437MHz


Power Spectral Density 802.11g Channel 11: 2462MHz



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


Power Spectral Density 802.11n (HT20) Channel 1: 2412MHz


Power Spectral Density 802.11n (HT20) Channel 6: 2437MHz

In any 100 kHz bandwidth outside the frequency band in which the spread spectrum or digitally modulated intentional radiator is operating, the radio frequency power that is produced by the intentional radiator shall be at least 20 dB below that in the 100 kHz bandwidth within the band that contains the highest level of the desired power, based on either an RF conducted or a radiated measurement, provided the transmitter demonstrates compliance with the peak conducted power limits. If the transmitter complies with the conducted power limits based on the use of RMS averaging over a time interval, as permitted under paragraph (b)(3) of this section, the attenuation required under this paragraph shall be 30 dB instead of 20 dB.



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

Channel 1: 2412MH



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

# 8.5.4 Test Procedure

This test is required for any spurious emission that falls in a Restricted Band, as defined in Section 15.205. It must be performed with the highest gain of each type of antenna proposed for use with the EUT. Use the following spectrum analyzer settings:

The EUT was placed on a turn table which is 0.8m above ground plane.

Maximum procedure was performed on the highest emissions to ensure EUT compliance.

Span = wide enough to fully capture the emission being measured

Follow the guidelines in ANSI C63.10-2013 with respect to maximizing the emission by rotating the EUT, measuring the emission while the EUT is situated in three orthogonal planes (if appropriate), adjusting the measurement antenna height and polarization, etc. A pre-amp and a high pass filter are required for this test, in order to provide the measuring system with sufficient sensitivity. Allow the trace to stabilize. The peak reading of the emission, after being corrected by the antenna factor, cable loss, pre-amp gain, etc., is the peak field strength, which must comply with the limit specified in Section 15.35(b). Submit this data.

Now set the VBW to 10 Hz, while maintaining all of the other instrument settings. This peak level, once corrected, must comply with the limit specified in Section 15.209. If the dwell time per channel of the hopping signal is less than 100 ms, then the reading obtained with the 10 Hz VBW may be further adjusted by a "duty cycle correction factor", derived from 20log(dwell time/100 ms), in an effort to demonstrate compliance with the 15.209 limit. 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# 8.7 ANTENNA APPLICATION

### 8.7.1 Antenna Requirement

FCC CRF Part15.203	An intentional radiator shall be designed to ensure that no antenna other than that furnished by the responsible party shall be used with the device. The use of a permanently attached antenna or of an antenna that uses a unique coupling to the intentional radiator shall be considered sufficient to comply with the provisions of this section. The manufacturer may design the unit so that a broken antenna can be replaced by the user, but the use of a standard antenna jack or electrical connector is prohibited. This requirement does not apply to carrier current devices or to devices operated under the provisions of §15.211, §15.213, §15.217,§15.219, or §15.221. Further, this requirement does not apply to intentionalradiators that must be professionally installed, such as perimeter protection systems and some field disturbance sensors, or to other intentional radiators which, in accordance with §15.31(d), must be measured at the installation site. However, the installer shall be responsible for ensuring that the proper antenna is employed so that the limits in this part are not exceeded.

For intentional device, according to FCC 47 CFR Section 15.203, an intentional radiator shall be designed to ensure that no antenna other than that furnished by the responsible party shall be used with the device. And according to FCC 47 CFR Section 15.247 (b), if transmitting antennas of directional gain greater than 6dBi are used, the power shall be reduced by the amount in dB that the directional gain of the antenna exceeds 6dBi.
