UNIFIED COMMUNICATIONS & COLLABORATION (UC&C)



Machine learning and unique

feature sets are now key for technology in this category. The collaborative hardware market has become a #me-too area saturated with video and audio products all boasting agnostic support

for any soft codec service, and more recently we have seen the software providers offering interoperability also.

The stars of the show will support analysis features including head count in the room or even facial recognition to help facilities management understand the use of their systems, presence technology to tailor the user experience from the moment they enter the room to the desired behaviours and even voice control for the ultimate in simplified systems.

This year we expect to see more manufacturers releasing product solutions for all room sizes from huddle rooms, through large board rooms and to the auditorium and conference spaces all supported by single hardware brands. The millennials are no longer 'entering' the workforce they now pretty much dominate it and bring with them an expectation of a wire-free world. ISE will

host plenty of content sharing solutions supporting all devices and operating systems. The key now to these function rich offerings is the user interface – user training for room systems is a thing of the past and customers expect the plug and play experience of the consumer world, if you find products at the show and can utilise their feature sets with minimal guidance from an expert you may be onto a winner.

LED




Through 2019 we saw a huge price shift in <2mm - <4mm LED. ISE will demonstrate that

2.5mm is now firmly the new 4mm of old. Price reduction in 1.5mm has and will continue to drive increased purchases showing how this NPP is no longer just for the elite.

Maturing manufacturing, higher demand and customer confidence is seeing a bigger shift to a mature technology market and the Chinese model arguably remains the best in the world at finding the balance in 'need to have' vs. 'nice to have'.

ISE will prove the main manufacturers are focusing on improving pixel technology to combat pixel failure and fragility, and image quality. SMD technology is still the dominant force, improved IMD SMD will take the SMD platform forward short term, with longer term development of mass transfer (chip on board) LED using mini and micro size LED chips seeing the LED platform realise its potential for display market domination.

LED (cont.)

We expect IMD SMD will be the major trend this year, it offers a better balance of display performance, price and single pixel repair compared to new chipon-board technologies using standard LED chip sizes and non-mass transfer techniques that compromise visual performance, price and serviceability.

Select manufacturers will showcase microLED, driven primarily by consumer brands who have the R&D budgets to push boundaries. These brands are chasing realisation of the technology for the much bigger consumer market opportunity.

DISPLAYS



Displays may have reached their temporary ceiling in terms of resolution and image quality.

That's not to say we cannot improve. but simply we must now give content production and distribution a chance to catch up.

ISE 2020 will see 4K as a standard resolution offering from most display manufacturers with just a few showing 8K solutions from a single panel. The OLED and QLED battle promises to give us some technology eye candy once again and of course the visual show stoppers will come from the transparent and flexible displays.

Thinner bezels from video walls and easy innovative mounting solutions will be complimented by more displays with off-board electronics.



Customers should plan to spend significant time with the interactive display vendors to fully understand the many features of the collaboration display and its positive impact on productivity. In-built wireless content sharing, single click to call conferencing solutions, increased hardwired connectivity and in-built extended desktop/videowall capability mean that one size really can fit all applications now.

Keep an eye out for design topographies such as simple and concise user interfaces, enterprise management platforms for large installs and features to increase accessibility for all levels of user. The ultimate collaborative displays will include machine learning and analytics for facilities management to keep up with the fast-developing UC hardware market.

PROJECTION



The biggest technology evolution in our market remains the transition from projection to flat panel in the meeting and learning space.

Yet with increased resolutions, lower cost of ownership and more brightness for your money projection remains a popular technology choice in these spaces still - so expect to see laser solutions from all of the main players.

Projection has historically had a monopoly on the immersive experience sector, only recently seeing competition from creative LED, curved and flexible displays.

The display manufacturers will have a harder job conquering these





applications as quickly as they have dented the presentation rooms as the projection manufacturers are adopting the laser technology in their brighter and professional grade units meaning previously difficult environments can be supported with long life and low service lighter weight options.

Now that many manufacturers have both rugged and easily concealed options they can focus on the functionality that will expose the weaknesses of their competition - bezels. Expect to see increased lens shift in-built blend capabilities as well as image warp and manipulation features in the shape of immersive rooms, projection mapping and dome projection.

NETWORKED AV





The benefits of AV over IP are now well

documented, and few are unaware of the increased scalability. reach and flexibility this distribution can offer over traditional

point to point and HDBaseT products.

This transition is still in its infancy with a nervousness demonstrated by many to take the jump and switch to IP based systems.

This year expect to see AV over IP solutions aggressively challenging legacy technologies with lots of UHD/4K, HDR support and reduced latencies. Until now many manufacturers promoted the benefits of using the customer's LAN for AV over IP signal management. This year,

however, most will promote dedicated networks and showcase plug and play set up capability with auto discovery and easy management interfaces.

For those concerned about compression look out for 10G solutions and maybe hints of 25GB solutions as we expect to see more 10 and 25GB ethernet switches. available in the market specifically tailored to media distribution and at continually reducing price points.

Brands in this space are no longer pitching conversion from legacy systems to customers, they are now pitching their solution against their competitors - a great indicator that the next technology evolution is about to ignite.

PROFESSIONAL VIDEO



As the cameras on our phones get better and better. professional video manufacturers

have had to up their game. More resolution. HDR. more cinematic looks and fantastic low light performance are the characteristics of the latest crop of professional cameras.


Meanwhile PTZ sales are going through the roof, they keep production costs down, because one operator can control multiple cameras. With extra software these cameras can now detect faces and track individuals to further automate production. Even cutting between cameras can now be done over the internet

At the high end of broadcast 8K is being whispered about, just as we were getting used to 4K.
