HOW DO I TRIM MY MAT?

Trimmable Mats can be tricky. The best way to "cut right to the point" (Yeah, that's a painful pun...) is to measure up your new mats to your OEM mats.

HOW DO I CLEAN MY FLOOR MATS?

Although there is plenty of variety in the market, floor mats for cars, trucks, vans and SUVs typically fall into one of two styles: carpet or rubber. Follow the guide appropriate to your mats below.

Cleaning Rubber Floor Mats

Remove them from your vehicle to avoid dirtying your interior.

Shake Well! Loosen up the debris and dirt in an appropriate area (make sure your neighbor isn't upwind!)

Break out the hose, if available. Hose down the mats to further remove unwanted particles. If a hose is unavailable, a bucket of water can do the trick.

Mix a light amount of baking soda and laundry detergent into water. A 1/4 Cup of each per gallon of water is about right.

Go ahead and soak the mats. Use a microfiber towel to scrub them down, since (dependent on the mats) a scrubbing sponge or anything rougher can leave marks and scratches.

Drying time! Hang them in a clean area, free from dust and winds.

Cleaning Carpet Floor Mats

Remove them from your vehicle.

Shake Well! Loosen up the dirt and debris.

Vacuum, if available. This will remove the rest of the larger particles. If no vacuum is available, a gentle rubbing with cloth can help loosen up more junk.

Stain Removal. Using your favorite chemical stain remover, blot any stains with a wet towel and the chemical. Follow instructions per chemical used. If no stains are present or no chemical cleaners are available move to the next step.

Check with the manufacturer, or here on the carxs product page. If the mats are machine washable, use a cold wash and let air dry. If not, let's go to step 6.

Apply dry baking soda and rub it into the carpet. Let sit for a bit if you seem to have an odor problems, this should help, unless it's some fast food trapped under your seat!

Scrub the baking soda with water and a bristle brush or scrubbing sponge.

To remove more stuck materials, like gum, use salt water.

Ensure a proper air dry, then your mats are ready for their next trip!
